

#### Drivers Be Warned: The summer slide isn't just for students.

This is the time of year when drivers tend to forget – or even worse – ignore the rules for sharing the roads with school buses. The Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office in Royal Palm Beach says there has been a recent spike in the number of school zone violations in the Village.

Thousands of children still ride school buses during the summer, attending both classes and camps. When you see a stopped school bus with the red lights flashing, here is what the law says you must do:

#### 316.172 Traffic to stop for school bus.

(1)(a) Any person using, operating, or driving a vehicle on or over the roads or highways of this state shall, upon approaching any school bus which displays a stop signal, bring such a vehicle to a full stop while the bus is stopped, and the vehicle shall not pass the school bus until the signal has been withdrawn. A person who violates this section commits a moving violation, punishable as provided in chapter 318.

(1)(b) Any person using, operating, or driving a vehicle that passes a school bus on the side that children enter and exit when the school bus displays a stop signal commits a moving violation, punishable as provided in chapter 318, and is subject to a mandatory hearing under the provision of s.318.19.


#### 318.19

(2) The driver of a vehicle upon a divided highway within an unpaved space of at least 5 feet, a raised median, or a physical barrier is not required to stop when traveling in the opposite direction of a school bus which is stopped in accordance with the provisions of this section.


(3) Every school bus shall stop as far right of the street as possible and shall display warning lights and stop signals as required by rules of the State Board of Education before discharging or loading passengers. When possible, a school bus shall not stop where the visibility is obscured for a distance of 200 feet either way from the bus.



**TWO LANE**: Vehicles traveling in both directions **MUST** stop.



**DIVIDED HIGHWAY**: (Unpaved space (min 5 ft) OR any raised median or physical barrier) Vehicles behind bus **MUST** stop. Vehicles traveling in the opposite direction proceed with caution.



**MULTI-LANE PAVED ACROSS**: Vehicles traveling in both directions **MUST** stop.

#### Safety Tips

- Children who rush are at greater risk of being injured. Get to the bus stop early.
- Stay three giant steps away from the road until the bus comes to a stop and the door opens.
- Never walk behind a school bus.
- Cross at least ten feet in front of a bus and make sure the driver sees you before stepping off curb.
- Wait until no cars are coming from either direction before crossing the street.
- If a car approaches, make eye contact with the driver and wait for the OK signal to cross.
- Conversations and play time should wait until you are safely seated, or safely away from the bus.
- If you drop something outside the bus, NEVER try to pick it up. Always tell the driver and wait for his or her instructions.

Summer is here in South Florida along with the Atlantic Hurricane Season which runs from June 1 – November 30.

# What You Need To Know <u>Before</u> A Storm

Hurricane hazards come in many forms, including storm surge, heavy rainfall, inland flooding, high winds, tornadoes and rip currents. The best way to deal with these hazards is to be prepared.

If you are planning to be out of town during hurricane season shutters can be installed on unoccupied properties with Village permission. Fill out the STORM PROTECTION EXTENDED DURATION NOTICE form available online or at Village Hall.

Before a storm residents may contact the Community Development Department for advice on best securing and protecting their property as well as preparing for limited services and resources. Community Development staff will canvas the Village to notify contractors and residents to secure any materials which may become hazards in the event of landfall.

#### Before the storm:

- Fuel up vehicles and charge cell phones.
- Double check supplies (Food, water, cash, medications, etc...).
- Install shutters and bring outdoor furniture indoors.
- Monitor local news for watches and warnings (A "watch" means that storm conditions are possible for the area, a "warning" means that storm conditions are expected for the area.).
- Do not trim or cut down trees, do any major yardwork or construction that produces debris once a storm is named unless you or your landscaper/contractor plan to transport debris to SWA facility!
- Once a watch or warning has been issued do not trim vegetation of any kind.

#### **During the storm:**

- Stay indoors.
- Turn off and unplug unnecessary electrical appliances.
- Stay away from windows and doors.
- Monitor local news for storm updates.

#### After the storm:

- Stay indoors until the weather is clear (Do not go outside during the "eye" of the storm.).
- Continue to monitor local news for updates.
- Avoid traveling on roadways. There may be electrical wires down and debris in the roadway.
- Do not use generators indoors!

## What You Need To Know <u>After</u> A Storm

#### **Debris Removal:**

Storm debris will be removed from rights-of-way, Village owned lands and all areas that have curbside garbage pickup. This includes gated communities with curbside pickup and an indemnity agreement with the Village but does not include communities with dumpster service. Do not block storm water drainage or access to utilities with debris.

#### **Boil Water Notices:**

If the water system loses power or water pressure, a boil water notice may be issued. Do not use untreated tap water. Tap water can be used after being brought to a rolling boil for one minute. An alternative is to add eight drops of unscented household bleach to a gallon of water and waiting 30 minutes before consuming.

#### **Community Development Services:**

After a storm teams will survey the Village, provide damage assessment reports, and determine if any structures are unsafe. Community Development will provide expedited manual permitting in the event of power outages and can be reached at the Village Hall location or by telephone at (561) 790-5128.

#### **Know Your Flood Zone:**

Everyone is at risk – even those who do not live close to rivers, lakes, canals, or the coast. The Village of Royal Palm Beach wants to remind people in moderate to low-risk areas that their risk is reduced, not removed. Call the Engineering Department at (561) 790–5103 to access FEMA's Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRM), to learn if a property is in a Special Flood Hazard Area, and if it may be affected by local drainage problems.




## Signature Park
