Rising Property Values & No Tax Rate Hike Highlight New Budget

The details of next year's Village of Royal Palm Beach budget are out and they include two very good pieces of news for village residents.

The first is home values in the village rose an average of 4.4% over last year. The second is village leaders will not be raising property tax rates.

Continuing the village's commitment to improving infrastructure, one out of every five dollars in the new budget is for capital projects. Meanwhile, speaking of property taxes, did you know property taxes only cover 20% of the operating budget? Many people don't realize how little property taxes actually pay for in local government.

The total budget for next year is just over \$45 million dollars.

It's official! The Village is looking for experts to design a new village hall.

The new building will be on the same campus as the current village hall. But that's about the only thing the two buildings will have in common.

The new building will be hurricane rated while the current village hall is not. That means operations will not need to move to another building during a storm. It also means post-storm operations will be up and running more quickly for residents.

The new building will be more energy efficient, take up less of a footprint, and consolidate all operations into a one-stop shop.

Construction is currently scheduled to begin at the end of 2020, and take about a year and a half.
