Engineering Updates

Road Resurfacing Project Update (PWXXRR)

Significant progress continues on the Village's road resurfacing and sidewalk improvement project.

Completed Work

Phases 1–3 and 9 have been completed. Additional work has been finalized in Phase 5, Phase 6 (Bilbao), Phase 7 (Bobwhite Road), and Phase 8, including road base rework, milling, and repaving.

On Royal Palm Beach Boulevard, curb replacement and road base improvements have been completed on the east side of the roadway adjacent to Veterans Park.

Upcoming Work

Crews will return to Phases 1–3 and 9 to address final punch list items. Work will continue in Phases 5–8 with ongoing milling and paving operations.

Along Royal Palm Beach Boulevard, upcoming work includes concrete repairs and road base work on the west side of the roadway, as well as the start of base rework near Meadowlark Drive.

This large-scale road and sidewalk improvement project is expected to continue through Summer 2026.

La Mancha Subdivision Underdrain (PW2204)

Final paving in the La Mancha subdivision has been completed. The project will now move into administrative closeout and site cleanup.

La Mancha Avenue Drainage Improvements (SW2504)

Underdrain installation has been completed along La Mancha Avenue. Road base rework is scheduled to begin next.

What Is a Right-of-Way and an Easement?

A right-of-way (ROW) is land reserved for public travel and public services—such as streets and sidewalks, as well as space for signs, streetlights, trees, and utilities.

An easement is a legal right to use a portion of private property for a specific purpose, most commonly for utilities (water, sewer, electric, drainage, and communications). The property owner still owns the land, but the easement area must remain accessible for its intended use.

What to expect: Residents may see utility locates (temporary paint on the ground and flags), inspections, maintenance, repairs, installation, or restoration activities within right-of-way and easement areas. Temporary access by personnel and equipment may be required and is permitted.



Who Maintains a Right-of-Way or Easement?

The property owner maintains the land surface within the right-of-way or easement area (for example, mowing and landscaping), as long as the work does not interfere with the easement's purpose.

The right-of-way or easement holder (utility company, government agency, HOA, or other party) maintains its facilities within the area (pipes, cables, manholes, drainage structures) and is responsible for the work it performs there.

Who Regulates Rights-of-Way and Easements?

The Village of Royal Palm Beach regulates the use of rights-of-way and easements in accordance with federal, state, and local laws and ordinances. Utility providers are required to obtain a permit for utility work in public rights-of-way and easements through the Village of Royal Palm Beach Engineering Department.

Utility providers are required to:

- Ensure the work is completed safely and does not eliminate access to the property owner.
- Install and maintain facilities in a way that minimizes impacts to property owners, other utility providers, and the general public.
- Restore disturbed rights-of-way and easements to their pre-construction condition.

Why Rights-of-Way and Easements Are Important

Easements and rights-of-way are important because they provide the Village and utility providers with the legal space and access needed to:

- Efficiently build and maintain essential facilities and services such as roads, drainage, sidewalks, sewer, water, electric, gas, internet, and other communications lines.
- Allow multiple service providers to operate, which can increase competition and help lower prices.
- Protect essential services by keeping access available so work can be completed safely and efficiently.

From the Fire Chief's Desk

Hello Royal Palm Beach neighbors,

Spring is in full swing, and it's one of the best times of year to enjoy our beautiful parks, neighborhoods, and community events. It continues to be an honor to serve this Village alongside the dedicated firefighters and paramedics of Palm Beach County Fire Rescue.

As we head further into Florida's dry season, April is an important month to focus on outdoor and brush fire prevention.

April Safety Message: Outdoor & Brush Fire Awareness

South Florida typically experiences increased brush fire activity this time of year due to lower rainfall, dry vegetation, and seasonal winds. Even in well-maintained neighborhoods, dry landscaping, mulch beds, and open green spaces can allow a small spark to spread quickly.

Please keep these reminders in mind:

- ◆ Keep grills at least 10 feet away from homes, fences, and patio covers
- ◆ Clear dry leaves and debris from around your home
- ◆ Avoid burning yard debris
- ◆ Never park vehicles on dry grass — hot exhaust systems can ignite vegetation
- ◆ Fully extinguish smoking materials before discarding
- ◆ Keep a hose or fire extinguisher nearby when grilling

Many brush fires begin with simple, preventable actions. Wind can carry embers farther than most people realize, putting nearby homes at risk. Taking a few precautions helps protect not only your property, but your neighbors as well.

Did You Know?

Wildfire season in Florida often peaks in the spring months before summer rains arrive. Palm Beach County Fire Rescue crews train year-round in brush fire response and coordinate closely with state forestry partners to protect our communities and green spaces. Preparedness and prevention go hand in hand.

A Little Royal Palm Beach History

Incorporated in 1959, Royal Palm Beach was thoughtfully designed with parks, lakes, and open spaces woven throughout the Village. Those beautiful natural areas are part of what make our community special — and they're also why seasonal fire awareness is so important this time of year.


Residents will notice several benefits right away:

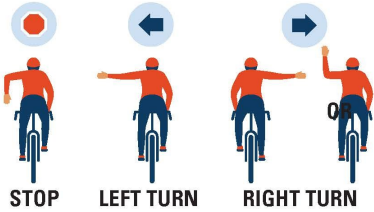

Bicycle Safety



STOP LEFT TURN RIGHT TURN

BUFFERED BIKE LANE

A buffered bike lane indicates a standard 7' or 6' wide bike lane. The extra line ("buffer" stripe) makes the lane look too narrow for motor vehicles. The lanes are wide enough to provide the 3' minimum passing distance required by law.



BIKE LANES WITH SOLID LINES

These are for people traveling on bicycles only. Motor vehicle drivers should not cross into these lanes unless they have yielded to bicyclists before turning.



BIKE LANES WITH DASHED LINES

These give bicyclists a place to ride, but motor vehicle drivers may need to merge into them at certain times. Motor vehicle drivers should yield to bicyclists before crossing the dotted line or making a turn.



BICYCLE DETECTOR MARKING

The Bicycle Detector Marking indicates where a bicyclist should stop to trigger a traffic signal. Place your bicycle wheels directly over the marking. Be patient! Some signal changes may take 3 minutes or longer!



Electric Bicycle Safety

Know Your Traffic Laws:

E-bikes are allowed on "any road, path or way that is open to bicycle travel." This means they can be ridden on roads (except limited access highways), bike lanes, bike paths, multi-use paths, and sidewalks. E-bikes must follow all traffic laws including riding with traffic and obeying traffic signals.

Protect Yourself:

Always wear a helmet regardless of your age. The law requires riders under the age of 16 to wear one at all times.

Control Your Speed and Brake Early:

E-bikes are quick to pick up momentum and can cause severe injury when at high speeds. Give yourself the appropriate amount of time to slow down.

Be Aware of Traffic and Pedestrians:

The more predictably you ride, the safer you are. Don't weave in and out of traffic. Always be courteous to pedestrians around you.

Stay Visible:

Know that you are not as visible to drivers as they are to you. Wear bright or reflective clothing and use lights when riding in low-light conditions or at night.
