Commons Park

The lighting at the Commons Park golf range has undergone a significant upgrade with the installation of new fixtures that boast a more aesthetic and compact form factor. What is a Neighborhood Watch?

According to the National Neighborhood Watch, a Division of the National Sheriff's Association, a Neighborhood Watch Program is a group of people living in the same area who want to make their neighborhood safer. They do so by working together and in conjunction with local law enforcement to reduce crime and improve the quality of life.

Essentially, a Neighborhood Watch Program is neighbors helping neighbors. A Neighborhood Watch Program helps people come together, know their neighbor's, what cars belong at what house, and whether people should be home or not.

Most people fear joining or starting up a program due to other obligations, no worries. A Neighborhood Watch Program only meets quarterly, and does so in a central location like a park, usually for about an hour. While not a requirement, the District 9 Community Outreach Coordinator recommends there be at least twenty (20) people to start a Neighborhood Watch Program.

This type of program can be initially facilitated in any community, but for those with Home Owners Associations (HOA's) its recommended it be run by a group of people other than the HOA board so as to keep the two separate from leadership. This type of separation allows people to be part of the Neighborhood Watch Program who may not want to be part of the HOA board.

How do you start a Neighborhood Watch Program? If you are interested in finding out more, you can c ontact the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office District 9 Community Outreach Coordinator, Diane Smith, at smithdiane@pbso.org.

If you do not want to have a Neighborhood Watch Program but want information about how to safe guard yourself against would-be-criminals, you can have a Crime Prevention Meeting and invite the Sheriff's Office to do a presentation. Either way, you have an opportunity to meet neighbors and stay informed.
