Unveiling of "Rooted" Sculpture



Engineering Updates

PW22RR – Road Resurfacing

A contractor has officially been selected for the upcoming large-scale road and sidewalk improvement project. The work is scheduled to begin in early summer and is expected to take approximately one year to complete. In addition to resurfacing the roads, the project will include significant upgrades to curbs and curb ramps throughout the area. These enhancements will not only address needed repairs but also ensure the improvements meet ADA standards, enhancing accessibility and safety for all residents.




La Mancha Subdivision Underdrain

Construction on this infrastructure improvement project is now underway and will continue into early 2026. The work includes the installation of underdrain systems along the edges of the roadway, which are designed to help protect the road base by diverting groundwater away from the pavement structure. This is a critical step in extending the life of the roadway and preventing long-term damage.

In addition to the drainage improvements, all roads within the project area will be fully resurfaced. These enhancements aim to provide residents and drivers with a smoother, safer, and more durable driving experience. Residents may notice periodic construction activity in the area, and we appreciate your patience and cooperation as we work to complete these vital improvements.

Royal Palm Beach Virtual Inspections

The Village of Royal Palm Beach Building Division, in partnership with VUSPEX, is offering virtual inspections to save you time and provide convenient access to many in-progress building inspections. Please review the information below on how to schedule and participate in a virtual inspection.

How to Schedule a Virtual Inspection:

- Schedule by 2 p.m. the day before using the phone system listed on your permit.
- On the morning of your inspection, call **561-790-5128** between 7:45 a.m. and 8:15 a.m. to set a time window for your inspection.
- You will receive a text message to start the inspection via your cell phone's camera.

Eligible Virtual Inspections Include:

- In-progress roof inspections
- Water heater, AC, electric service, garage, and entry door change-outs

During your inspection, you will verify your address and permit documents and show requested construction components to the inspector through your phone's camera. Not all inspections qualify for virtual service, and some may require an in-person visit.

YOU HAVE THE POWER TO E-BIKE SAFELY

With e-bike popularity on the rise, be sure you and your loved ones know the laws, regulations, and responsibilities that come along with riding electric devices like e-bikes and e-motos.

1 KNOW YOUR TRAFFIC LAWS:

- E-bikes are allowed on "any road, path or way that is open to bicycle travel." This means
 they can be ridden on roads (except limited access highways), bike lanes, bike paths,
 multi-use paths, and sidewalks.
- . E-bikes must follow all traffic laws including riding with traffic and obeying traffic signals.

2 PROTECT YOURSELF:



- Always wear a helmet regardless of your age. The law requires riders under the age of 16 to wear one at all times.
- Limit distractions and never wear ear buds when riding.

3 CONTROL YOUR SPEED AND BRAKE EARLY:



 E-bikes are quick to pick up momentum and can cause severe injury when at high speeds. Give yourself the appropriate amount of time to slow down.

4 BE AWARE OF TRAFFIC AND PEDESTRIANS:



- The more predictably you ride, the safer you are. Don't weave in and out of traffic.
- Always be courteous to pedestrians around you.

5 STAY VISIBLE



 Know that you are not as visible to drivers as they are to you.
 Wear bright or reflective clothing and use lights when riding in low-light conditions or at night.

DID YOU KNOW?

E-bikes have different classifications, with different rules for each. Know what class your bike falls in, so you can follow the appropriate bike laws.
