Citizen Observer Patrol (C.O.P.)

- The C.O.P. Unit provided 576 volunteer hours:
 - Active Members: 4
 - Miles Driven: 1,656
 - Patrolled Parks 419 times
 - Conducted Over 141 Business Checks
- The value of 576 volunteer hours: \$18,207.36





District 9 Support Statistics

- Bicycle equipped deputies provided 44 patrol hours.
- Mounted Unit provided 20 patrol hours.
- Deputies provided 54 hours of Marine Patrol in the Village.
- Fingerprinting Services processed 1,381 requests for fingerprints at the District 9 Lobby.
- District 9 ARU specialist handled 234 calls, with 125 case numbers pulled.
- Lobby processed 210 lbs. of unwanted prescriptions.





- CFS decreased 3.3%












- All 12 of the Forcible Rapes were acquaintance related.

UCR Statistical Comparison 2014 – 2024




Robbery Incidents






- CY 2024: 8 cases

- Note:

 - Two cases were acquaintance related.
 - Two cases victims refused to cooperate.
 - Two cases to business.




Larceny Incidents






- CY 2024 had 542 Larcenies, 119 more than CY 2023, a 28.1% increase.
- Shoplifting incidents accounted for 62.17% of all Larceny incidents.

Burglary Incidents



- In CY 2024, Residential Burglary incidents decreased 25%.
- From CY 2020 to present, Residential Burglaries decreased 25%.
- In CY 2024, Business Burglary incidents decreased 70%.
 Storage unit burglaries decreased 91% from 32 to 3.
- Multiple business burglaries were cleared by arrest.


LPR Cameras

CY 2025 Goals

- Provide Internet Safety Presentation to all parents of Royal Palm Beach Elementary Schools
- Continue traffic enforcement to reduce crashes and educate the public on safety measures
- Continue to educate the public via sign boards, social media, and e-alerts to HOA's and business owners on crime prevention issues.
- The District 9 Street Crimes Unit will continue to collaborate with the South Florida Task Force, Violent Crimes
 Division, Narcotics and other West Regional Bureau Street Crimes Units to address significant issues affecting multiple
 areas throughout the West Regional Bureau
- Crime Reduction through expanded use of Directed Patrol Plans and Community Education
- Continue working with the community to reduce the amount of vehicle thefts and burglaries
- Continue working with the Village of Royal Palm Beach Technical Site Review Committee (TSR) on law enforcement's involvement in the Village's growth with proven CPTED principles
- Continue the collaborative efforts between detectives, road patrol deputies and street team agents to identify and solve specific identifiable crimes
- Assist Village with maintenance of the LPR camera system by identifying when cameras are inoperable
- Maintain and enhance the partnership with Lutheran Services
- The District 9 Street Crimes Unit will continue its partnership with the Department of Juvenile Justice to identify known
 juvenile offenders on probation so they can be monitored
- Continue to utilize the District Community Outreach Coordinator/Crime Prevention Practitioner and CPTED trained liaison deputies to educate the community and businesses on crime prevention methods and strategies
- Continue the established partnership with Wal-Mart, Target, and Lowes administrators to report thefts in a timely manner while encouraging them to add extra security measures to reduce the number of shoplifting incidents
