Agenda Item:

PUBLIC HEARING FOR SECOND READING AND ADOPTION OF ORDINANCE NO. 1012, AMENDING CHAPTER 2. ADMINISTRATION. OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE VILLAGE OF ROYAL PALM BEACH AT ARTICLE V. CODE ENFORCEMENT. AT SECTION 2-111. SCHEDULE OF VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES. TO UPDATE EXHIBIT A AND REFERENCE THERETO; PROVIDING THAT EACH AND EVERY OTHER SECTION AND SUB-SECTION OF CHAPTER 2. ADMINISTRATION. SHALL REMAIN IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT AS PREVIOUSLY ADOPTED; PROVIDING A CONFLICTS CLAUSE, A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE AND AUTHORITY TO CODIFY; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES. Issue:

Ordinance 351 adopted in August 1990 codified Exhibit A which is a schedule containing the maximum civil penalties for non-criminal infractions of the Village Code. In recent months, the Village Council enacted several community enhancement ordinances as part of its Strategic Planning initiative, including:

- Ordinance 1005 (public park hours) which modified the Village's public park hours of operation;
- Ordinance 1006 (right-of-way solicitation and distribution) which opted the Village into the County's solicitation and distribution ordinance; and
- Ordinance 1007 (trespass in public parks) which included reference to several sections of the Village Code which could be violated and result in civil citations being issued.

Enactment of these community enhancement ordinances necessitates an update to Exhibit A, the schedule of civil penalties referenced above, to include additional noncriminal infractions and the associated civil penalties for each.

Recommended Action:

Upon Council review, staff recommends a motion to adopt Ordinance No. 1012 on second reading.

ORDINANCE NO. 1012

AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF ROYAL PALM BEACH, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 2. ADMINISTRATION. OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE VILLAGE OF ROYAL PALM BEACH AT ARTICLE V. CODE ENFORCEMENT. AT SECTION 2-111. SCHEDULE OF VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES. TO UPDATE EXHIBIT A AND REFERENCE THERETO; PROVIDING THAT EACH AND EVERY OTHER SECTION AND SUB-SECTION OF CHAPTER 2. ADMINISTRATION. SHALL REMAIN IN FULL FORCE AND EFFECT AS PREVIOUSLY ADOPTED; PROVIDING A CONFLICTS CLAUSE, A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE AND AUTHORITY TO CODIFY; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the Village Council enacted Ordinance No. 351 in August 1990 which included a schedule containing the maximum civil penalties for civil infractions of the Village Code, references as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, the Village Council desires to update Chapter 2. Administration. of the Village Code of Ordinances in order to update Exhibit A to include additional civil penalties authorized under the Village Code since original enactment; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Royal Palm Beach has held all required public hearings and has provided public notice in accordance with applicable State statutes and Village ordinances; and

WHEREAS, the Village Council of the Village of Royal Palm Beach has determined that the proposed revisions to Chapter 2 of the Village Code of Ordinances are in the best interests of the general welfare of the Village.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF ROYAL PALM BEACH, FLORIDA, THAT:

Section 1: Chapter 2. Administration. of the Code of Ordinances of the Village of Royal Palm Beach is hereby amended at Article V. Code Enforcement. at Sec. 2-111. Schedule of violations and penalties. to update Exhibit A and reference thereto; providing that Sec. 2-111. Schedule of violations and penalties. shall hereafter read as follows:

Sec. 2-111. - Schedule of violations and penalties.

(a) Any violation of a provision of the Code which is enforced pursuant to this division is a civil infraction.

(b) A schedule containing the maximum civil penalty in the event a person contests a citation, and the maximum civil penalty in the event a person elects not to contest a citation is contained in Exhibit A herein, as amended from time to time.

Editor's note— Exhibit A referred to in this section is not included herein but is on file and available for inspection in the village clerk's office.

Section 2: Each and every other Section and Sub-section of Chapter 2. Administration. shall remain in full force and effect as previously enacted.

Section 3: All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict be and the same are hereby repealed.

<u>Section 4</u>: Should any section or provision of this Ordinance or any portion thereof, any paragraph, sentence or word be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remainder of this Ordinance.

<u>Section 5</u>: Specific authority is hereby granted to codify this Ordinance.

Section 6: This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon passage.
