Please transfer \$500,000.00 from the 302 fund balance to the Robiner Park Pathway and Kayak Launch Project, project number PR1807, account number-302-7200-572.46-60.

When the original project estimate was created the project was a simple resurfacing project with a boat ramp for maintenance, kayak launch, and new fencing for the dog park. During design it was discovered that that a large percentage of the pathway was out of ADA compliance, which would require the base to be re-worked. There are also a large number of trees in close proximity to the pathway. The two factors made converting the pathways to concrete a more cost effective option when considering future maintenance. It was also discovered that the parking lot had sub-standard backing distance, base thickness, and ADA issues. In order to fix the said issues, the entire lot will need to be rebuilt. Parks & Recreation also requested additional improvements to the park, such as a pavilion at the dog park; Kayak launch parking; expansion of the walkway system; additional fencing; a dog drinking fountain; new benches and trash cans. Finally, the effects of Covid-19 have caused construction costs to rise 30-35% over the last year.

The additional funding will allow for the full project to be awarded along with a \$50,000 contingency fund.
