Definitions of Terms

POLICY -

is an issue that needs direction or a policy decision by the Council; or needs a major funding decision by the Council; or an issue that needs Council leadership by the governing body in the community; or with other governmental bodies (Village government, other Village governments, state government, federal government) – questions of "WHAT: IS THE DIRECTION; IS THE GOAL; IS THE BUDGET OR RESOURCES; IS THE VILLAGE'S POLICY OF REGULATION?"

MANAGEMENT -

a management action which the Council has set the overall direction and provided initial funding (e.g., phased project), may require further Council action on funding; or a major management project particularly multiple years (e.g., upgrade to the information system) – questions of "HOW: DO WE ADDRESS THE ISSUE, MANAGE THE VILLAGE; IMPLEMENT A DECISION OR PROGRAM; CAN WE IMPROVE THE MANAGEMENT OR ORGANIZATIONAL PROCESS?"

MANAGEMENT IN PROGRESS -

a management or organization action which Council has set the direction, needs staff work before going to Council for direction next year or beyond, no choice mandated by an outside governmental agency or institution, management process improvement budgeted or funded by the Council.

MAJOR PROJECT -

a capital project funded in the CIP or by Council action which needs design or to be constructed (e.g., Road project, Village facility project, park project, etc.).

ON THE HORIZON –

an issue or project that will not be addressed during the year by management or the Council but should be addressed in the next five years; it could become an action item for this year if another party moves the issue or project forward – it depends on them.

Success: Bridge Slope Stabilization, PW1806; Completed and closed out the 1st project. Consultant has completed the revisions to the plans based on the lessons learned from the 1st project. This is a multi-year project.****

Impacts: This project is required to meet State of Florida requirements for bridge maintenance.

Success: Bridge Slope Stabilization, PW1806; Completed an emergency repair to Bridge Number 937367.

Impacts: The bridge slope was undermined due to a break in the drainage next to the bridge. The slope failure undermined the bridge and was a potential hazard to pedestrian and vehicular traffic. The repair eliminated the hazard.

- Success: Bridge Slope Stabilization, PW1806; Completed an emergency repair to Bridge Number 937352. This work was completed in FY2022.
- **Impacts:** The bridge slope had failed from a damaged irrigation line that undermined the recently laid membrane and rock. The slope failure severely undermined the pedestrian bridge supports. The repair eliminated the hazard.
- Success: Trucks, PW21TR; DPW purchased the replacement of one (1) truck in the DPW fleet. This project is complete.
- **Impacts:** The replacement of vehicles is done in accordance with the Public Works Vehicle Replacement Guidelines.
- Success: Equipment Replacement, PW2001; DPW issued P.O.'s for two (2) enclosed trailers; and a John Deere skid steer.

Impacts: The replacement of equipment is part of our long-term equipment replacement program.

- Success: Bus Shelters, PW17BS; DPW issued a P.O. for the replacement of a bus shelter that was destroyed in an automobile accident in May 2021. DPW received notification that the bus shelter shipped on February 24, 2022 and will be delivered on March 4, 2022.****
- **Impacts:** The bus shelters are designed to meet ADA requirements. The shelters will benefit the users of the Palm Tran system by providing cover during inclement weather.

Success: Sidewalk Trip Hazards; DPW completed the repair of sidewalk trip hazards throughout the Village that were identified in FY2021.****

- **Impacts:** The sidewalk maintenance program is needed to provide safe pedestrian use of the Village sidewalks.
- Success: Sidewalk Pressure Cleaning; DPW bid the pressure cleaning work on Belvedere Rd., SR7 & SR80 for FY2021. We issued a NTP for the new and current year contracts. Completed the sidewalk pressure cleaning work for FY2021.
- **Impacts:** The sidewalk pressure cleaning is done annually and includes sidewalks along Village owned properties and private properties that abut major roadways and that don't have an HOA. The work provides safe, clean surfaces for pedestrian travel and improves the aesthetics of the roadway.
- **Success:** Civic Center Way Monument Signs, PW2004; The landscape architect completed design of the of the monument signs. The construction of the monument signs will be included in the new VH project.
- **Impacts:** The monument signs will identify the locations of the Cultural Center, the Palm Beach County Library, and PBC Midwestern Service Center.
- Success: A/C Replacement, PW21AC; We have completed the replacement of Unit-6 at PBSO District 9 and Unit-2 at Bob Marcello Park. DPW issued P.O. for the re-build of AHU-7 at the Recreation Center and is currently waiting on a material shipment from Trane.
- **Impacts:** The replacement of air conditioning units is part of our long-term a/c replacement program.

Success: Backflow Preventer Replacement, PW21BF; Ongoing project. FY21 work complete.

Impacts: The backflow preventer replacement project is to ensure that all backflows are tested, repaired and/or replaced, as needed, annually. The program is required by Palm Beach County cross-connection control rules.

- Success: Storm Drain Outfall Replacement, PW21SD; DPW issued P.O. for the replacement of pipe between Ponds 02-06/02-31 in FPL easement. We issued P.O. for the replacement of pipe end in Pond 02-33 in FPL easement. DPW solicited quotes for the replacement of outfall pipe in FPL easement. PW21SD was carried over into FY2022.
- **Impacts:** The outfall pipes, pipes, and/or new headwall, where needed, were constructed in accordance with FDOT standards.
- **Success:** Street Restriping, PW21SR: Completed restriping of La Mancha Avenue from the roundabout at Bilbao to the roundabout at Madrid.
- **Impacts:** The street restriping was completed in accordance with FDOT standards. The striping benefits the traveling public by increased visibility of the roadway markings.
- Success: Street Sign R&R, PW21SS; Completed the purchase and installation of all signs in Zone 4.
- **Impacts:** The Street Sign R&R project was expanded to meet the MUTCD sign retro-reflectivity requirements that went into effect in January 2012. The MUTCD retro-reflectivity requirements ensure that traffic signs are maintained at a minimum retro-reflectivity so that they will be visible to drivers at all times, both day and night.
- Success: Street Light Replacement LED, PW2102; DPW issued P.O.'s for the purchase of 57 LED fixtures for Huntington Woods & Royal Pine Estates subdivisions; and, 115 LED fixtures for the La Mancha subdivision. We have completed the Huntington Woods & Royal Pine Estates subdivisions and Barcelona Dr. & Bilbao St. in La Mancha subdivision.
- **Impacts:** The project is a multi-year project. The LED fixtures are significantly more energy efficient and have a longer life than the existing fixtures.
- Success: Guard Rail Replacement, PW2104; DPW issued a P.O. for the replacement of guard rail on Raven Ct. bridge.
- **Impacts:** The project is a multi-year project that is to replace the guardrail with current FDOT standard guardrail. The FY2021 work is complete.
- Success: Street Light Replacement La Mancha, PW2105; DPW issued P.O.'s for the purchase of concrete poles, fixtures and fixture arms for ten (10) lights on Ponce de Leon.
 Impacts: The existing lighting has reached its useful life and needs to be replaced. The project is a multi-year project.

Success: Belvedere Road Lighting, PW2106; DPW issued P.O. for roadway bore for the installation of additional street lights in the median on Belvedere Road. DPW had the poles, fixtures, and wiring in house to complete the project.

Impacts: The project is complete.

Success: School Zone Flashing Beacons, PW2107; The Village's consultant completed the plans for school zone flashing beacons for Cypress Trails Elementary School, Crestwood Middle School, and H.L. Johnson Elementary School. DPW issued a P.O. for the school zone flashing beacons needed for Cypress Trails Elementary School.****

Impacts: The project is needed to comply with FDOT requirements for school zone flashing beacons. The requirement must be met by 2022.

Success: Okeechobee Blvd. Lighting Replacement, PW2108; DPW issued P.O.'s for the purchase of ten (10) aluminum poles, fixture arms and LED cobra head fixtures.

Impacts: The project is complete.

Success: Debris Removal Services; DPW bid the Debris Removal Services contract. The bid was awarded and a NTP was issued for the 1st Term of the Contract. The Contract initial term is two (2) years with the ability to renew for 2 additional two (2) year terms.

Impacts: The Village desires to have a Contractor in place to provide Debris Removal Services in the event of a major windstorm.

Success: Public Works Lobby; DPW identified the need to secure and isolate the FOC lobby to regulate the access to the building. The project was started FY2020 with the installation of a storefront on the main entrance and completed in FY2021 with the installation of a secondary doorway and modifications to the employee/public interface.

Impacts: The project is complete.

Success: Camellia Park Ditch Restoration Funding; The Camellia Park Ditch Restoration was originally programed in CIP Camellia Park Drainage Improvements, PR1822. The ditch restoration funding was included in the Parks project. DPW established a CIP for Canal Bank Maintenance, PW2205, which is included in the FY2022 CIP. The dredging of this section of canal will be completed with the overall canal dredging program.

Impacts: The funding of the Camellia Park Ditch Restoration is complete.

Success: FOC Exterior Door Strike; DPW experienced an extended power outage when the transformer that serves the building was struck by lightning. The outage was sufficiently long enough for the battery backups for the exterior door mag locks to drain. Since the mag locks failed open, the FOC was left unsecured for a period of time over a weekend. The change out of the mag locks with strikes was coordinated with IS Dept. In the event of another extended power outage, the door strikes will fail closed and the FOC building will be secure.

Impacts: The project is complete.

Success:	Operation Pill Drop at the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office District 9 Substation has been a success since being brought to The Village of Royal Palm Beach and has provided the opportunity for residents in the Village and surrounding areas to drop off unused/unwanted prescription drugs to be properly disposed of safely and effectively.
Impacts:	This program removes thousands of pounds of unwanted/unused prescription drugs from the homes of residents in Royal Palm Beach therefore minimizing the opportunities for those drugs to be inappropriately used or stolen. Prescription Drug Overdoses continue to be a growing problem not only in Palm Beach County but throughout the country. The residents of Royal Palm Beach have come to rely on the Pill Drop to dispose of their unwanted prescription drugs. Last year the lobby was only open for a few months due to Covid; however, in that time 86.45 lbs. of unwanted pills were processed through evidence to be destroyed.

Success: Due to COVID-19 and CDC restrictions, the Police Athletic League District 9 Boxing Program (P.A.L.) was only open to the public for the month of December. During that time five (5) new participants signed up to attend the program and several existing boxers returned. This program will re-open in 2022.

Impacts: The P.A.L. Boxing Program assists boys and girls in much more than just learning the sport of boxing. This program was established to give positive exposure to at-risk youth or individuals who may not have much guidance in their lives and show that law enforcement is there to help them.

- **Success:** The P.B.S.O. COP Units is utilized for traffic control, crash incidents, high profile events and special projects. PBSO ensures C.O.P personnel is constantly provided with new innovative training, and updated equipment. In 2021 Volunteer hours totaled 1384 which is a cost savings to the Village of \$11,847.04. In addition, several COP Units are trained on how to program and move the Message Boards regularly utilized to thwart crime and reduce complacency.
- **Impacts:** Volunteers are valued greatly at the Sheriff's Office and in District 9. Supervisors often utilize these individuals for a plethora of community events within the Village of Royal Palm Beach. District 9 is fortunate to have volunteers that are highly skilled and trained in traffic and parking enforcement aspects. District 9 deputies are able to utilize them in traffic and other high-profile situations that free up deputies to respond to ongoing calls. Segways are utilized when the members of the District 9 COP assist at the four large events that the Village of Royal Palm Beach holds each year at Commons Park. Their assistance during these projects and more are essential in our goal to keep the citizens of Royal Palm Beach crime free and safe at all times.
- Success: District 9 is fortunate to be the only district in Palm Beach County to have a Community Outreach Coordinator assigned to the district. Communication is the key to a successful partnership with residents and business owners. Community meetings, Crime Prevention Meetings and Neighborhood Watch Programs are planned and carried out regularly at the request of the communities. This partnership helps assists in keeping the lines of communication open between law enforcement and the community. Participating in and organizing community programs and events are on the forefront of District 9's ability to stay visible and part of the community. The Community Outreach Coordinator is someone the community members in Royal Palm Beach have come to rely on for a seamless line of communication with the Sheriff's Office. This allows the Sheriff's Office to maintain a partnership with members of the community, which is essential, especially when trying to reduce crime and encourage the reporting of crimes and suspicious incidents. In addition to the Community Outreach Coordinator attending meetings, she also coordinates and attends many special projects, which include: Easter Bunny Inc., School Supply Drive with local elementary schools, Thanksgiving Food Drive partnering with Rotary, Shop with a Cop, Trunk or Treat and several Law Enforcement Appreciation presentations.
- **Impacts:** The Community Outreach Coordinator works closely with all deputies encouraging them to utilize crime prevention strategies and education when dealing with those they come in contact with daily thus instilling the true principles of Community Policing. Public speeches and Crime Prevention Training is often requested and supplied to civic groups, organizations, clubs and children's groups to educate those who may fall victim to would-be-criminals. Hundreds of people are taught and influenced in the area of crime prevention each year which is an essential part of reducing crime and apprehending criminals. The contact made through deputies and the Sheriff's Office participating in outreach programs/events has made community members more at ease when having to contact or deal with law enforcement officials if a situation deems it necessary.

Success: P.B.S.O. District 9 Detective Bureau an enormous influence on the change of the countywide pawn database system from RAPID to the much larger and efficient LeadsOnline****

Impacts: The transition to the LeadsOnline system allowed detectives to more efficiently search for stolen items that may have been pawned in surrounding counties and throughout the nation, which we were not able to do before.

Success: The District 9 Evidence Room was strategically relocation and updated with new evidence lockers, which not only expanded the ability to accommodate larger seized items but also has a much greater capacity to store more items than the previous location.

Impacts: This newly created area now efficiently allows deputies from District 9 and surrounding districts to process and secure evidence. Deputies are able to write reports in the Report Writing Room and process all evidence in the same location. This makes it more convenient when there are multiple pieces of evidence that need to be processed and diminishes room for errors.

- **Success:** High profile, proactive approaches to combating Vehicle and Residential Burglaries is an essential and one of the top priorities in District 9. Deputies are encouraged to patrol school zones while looking for and apprehending would-be criminals during the day time hours. Due to schools having remote learning during the 2021 school year, deputies concentrated patrolling in neighborhoods, which lead to only 1 Truant in 2021.
- **Impacts:** Residential Burglaries decreased 17% in 2021 due to the proactive posture taken by deputies. When in classroom learning returns, truants will continue to be returned back to school where they belong helps in minimizing the chances that they will commit a crime of opportunity in and around the school or in their communities.
- **Success:** Due to the increase in violence on school and college campuses in South Florida and throughout the country, continued training and seamless partnerships with local schools and their administrators is a must! Emergency plans are kept up to date at District 9 where all first responders have up-to-date information if responding to a call for assistance. Additionally, every deputy in the district was given access to the school through either a key or a swipe card for emergency purposes
- **Impacts:** Communication is essential!! Creating a partnership with Principals and School Board Police breaks down barriers and allows everyone to be on the same page if a response is ever needed at one of the local schools.

Success: P.B.S.O. District 9 is one of only four locations throughout Palm Beach County that provides fingerprinting services. In 2021, District 9 processed 380 requests for fingerprints.

Impacts: The Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office allows those in and around Royal Palm Beach this service thus creating an additional service to the public.

Success: Inter-agency Units Proactive Approach to Crime and Crime Prevention. Through the utilization of all P.B.S.O. assets/units, District 9 is able to request and deploy an array of different policing tactics depending on current needs and criminal activity. In 2021 Mounted Unit hours totaled 9.5, Bike hours 232 hours and Marine 48 hours.****

- **Impacts:** The utilization of units such as Marine, Motors, Mounted, K-9, S.P.O.T. (Sexual Predators & Offenders Tracking Program), Gang Unit, Narcotics Bureau, Violent Crimes Bureau, and the Eagle Helicopter, District 9 increases the ability to thwart crime and apprehend suspects when needed. In addition to these units, PBSO District 9 has many bike-certified deputies who are able to travel in and out of areas without being detected thus allowing arrests to be made where otherwise marked units would not be able to patrol.
- Success: Utilizing the District 9 ATV's for patrol, special events and specific complaints in the Village of Royal Palm Beach. Two (2) additional deputies were ATV trained and certified 2021
- **Impacts:** Patrol vehicles cannot get everywhere; therefore, there are several different modes of transportation utilized to catch criminals in the act. ATV's are certainly one of those vehicles, and allow law enforcement to patrol parks, nature preserves and other terrain that would be difficult for regular patrol vehicles to patrol. These assets are utilized frequently for regular patrols and for searches involving missing children or at-risk adults

Success: District 9 has a full time ARU Specialist assigned to the front lobby as the first point of contact with the public. In efforts to minimize any COVID issues, a Thermal Body Scanner was purchased. Although the lobby was closed to the public, information was provided for the public to follow on the manner by which calls for service could be answered.

Impacts: This position has allowed more individuals to take advantage of the services provided by the District 9 Substation as well as free up any deputy needing to respond to handle calls for service. In 2021 the District 9 ARU Specialist handled 324 calls with 228 case numbers pulled.

- Success: District 9 utilized unconventional ways to thwart crime and remain high profile in the Village of Royal Palm Beach. The four passenger Polaris 4X4 allows deputies to travel in areas that are difficult for patrol vehicles to patrol. Two (2) additional deputies were ROV trained and certified in 2021.
- **Impacts:** Specialty vehicles such as this are truly an asset to District 9 Village of Royal Palm Beach. Many special events and/or high-profile calls have the need for vehicles which provide higher visibility and maneuverability than a patrol vehicle. This Polaris 4X4 allows District 9 certified personnel to respond to events and incidents as needed.

Success: District 9 participated in several agency-wide operations:

- Operation Bus Stop Safety
- Operation Safe Ride (Bike Helmets)
- Operation: Safe Zones Keeping Our School Zones Safe Calendar Year 2021

Multi-district progressive Traffic initiatives

- **Impacts:** These operations, some done in conjunction with other districts, provided District 9 with the opportunity to address problems such as vehicles being left unlocked and drivers passing stopped busses that were picking up children or letting off students. Additionally, most parents do not know the laws about bike helmet safety; therefore, helmets and bike laws are distributed to those without them.
- **Success:** District 9 utilizes unconventional means of crime prevention and inelegance gathering. We utilize a few different Platform Vehicles to help catch would-be-criminals and thwart crimes before or as they are being committed.
- **Impacts:** The Platform Vehicle continues to allow District 9 to displace criminal activity by providing intelligence and other suspect information to help build criminal cases.
- **Success:** District 9 deployed two (2) additional Variable Message Boards through a COVID-19 Grant as a joint applicant with the Village of Royal Palm Beach.
- **Impacts:** The four (4) current messaging boards are used as a high visibility means by which to convey important safety messages to the public.
- Success: District 9 deployed a new Platform vehicle which replaced the antiquated platform van. In addition to a night surveillance scope and a long-distance surveillance spotting scope have been purchased to assist with surveillance and other intelligence gathering operations. These assets are necessary tools utilized by the five (5) Street Team members to efficiently and proactively solve and/or thwart crime.
- **Impacts:** The District 9 Street Team is utilized in many capacities, but their primary function is to use covert tactics and intelligence gathering to apprehend criminals and disperse crime out of the district.

Success: District 9 finalized the work with the Village of Royal Palm Beach and were able to update the following ordinances to allow for affective enforcement: Penalties were added to Criminalize Trespass Ordinance for Public Property/Lands Sec. 18-7 Solicitation and Distribution on Public Roads can also be enforced through • threw use of Florida traffic statute and citations and be issued. Impacts: Having laws that allow deputies to patrol and protect all those who work, live and visit Royal Palm Beach is essential. As homeless move in and out of the area, these two areas of enforcement will allow deputies to make contact and inform of resources available as well as displacing anyone who is either trespassing on private property or hindering traffic flow. Success: Having the proper tools and equipment allow members of law enforcement to do their jobs properly, professionally and efficiently with minimal impact on the community they serve. Additional equipment was purchased with both budgeted funds and funds obtained through the COVID-19 Grant.**** That equipment included: Arlo cameras for Street Team members Two (2) 35mm cameras to assist with investigations • Two (2) Covert Trackers for investigations •

- Additional PPE equipment
- Night Vision Goggles for Street Team members
- A remote surveillance platform
- Eleven (11) Stalker/Radars

Impacts: These assets are a force multiplier to assist the deputies in the deputies Law Enforcement functions.

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
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



- As we continue to implement Project Dox we are always learning and seeking ways to streamline the process. We must continue refining documents and guidelines to educate our customers and make the system less daunting and more efficient.
- Public Records requests continue to expand in frequency and scope. This growth in demand requires significant resources to properly address. While we adjust to these demands and make our data more readily available, we must also balance the privacy mandates of our "confidential records".
- As growth of our Western communities begins to become a reality, we are beginning to see the impact of increased traffic demands. We must continue to support completion of the State Road #7 connection to Northlake Blvd and the proper expansion of Southern Blvd. to accommodate the pay thru traffic.
- The pandemic and recovery, population movements, inflation, housing demands, lack of affordable housing, community and world pressures and a seemingly growing discontent of government continue to create significant socio and economic impacts at all levels. Many businesses will suffer or go dark. Many homeowners may be out of work. Increases in adult children living at home and or elderly parents living with their children will have an impact on our community as our SF homes are asked to provide for more persons. We must be diligent to maintain a compassionate approach to Code Enforcement, always aware of the sensitive balance of protecting quality of life issues, property values and our residents' appreciation of services.
- Southern Properties, Publix Demo and Rebuild and Townhomes behind Winn Dixie are very large projects which may commence at nearly the same timeframe. Areas on RPB Blvd North of Okeechobee will require significant management to progress while protecting the public on these heavily traveled roadways.

The cycle visit schedule may have delays due to Covid-19 impacts on FEMA staffing.
- Workforce tracking for Public Works using ESRI GIS tools for work order assignments. Implement a more comprehensive time and task tracking for use by Public Works.
- Automated mapping of open permits (building, eng, ROW...) Dashboard and maps to visualize status.
- Streamline process for new engineering and ROW permits for mapping and entry into various Survey123 applications. (Engineering inspections and NPDES Inspections.)
- Renovation and Expansion Recreation Center(PR2001)-Architectural / Engineering design and construction for the expansion and renovation of the Recreation Center. The expansion will include a 9800-sf gymnasium, 4 meeting rooms, a kitchen, and restrooms totaling 5500 sf. The project also includes the expansion and resurfacing of the parking lot and upgrading entry feature signage.
- La Mancha Avenue Extension(EN2103)-Extend La Mancha Ave. from the Bilbao Street Circle to Okeechobee Blvd. and construct a signal. The roadway will be aligned with the existing median cut on Okeechobee Blvd. that currently serves the Public Works building.

- 17. Street Light Fixture Replacement, PW2102; This is a multi-year project. DPW has advertised an ITB for the 2nd year of the project.
- Guard Rail Replacement, PW2104; DPW issued a P.O. and coordinated for the replacement of the guard rail on Bobwhite Rd. bridge and the Goldfinch Ln. bridge. This is a multi-year project and 2nd year is complete.
- 19. Street Light Replacement La Mancha, PW2105; This is a multi-year project. DPW has advertised an ITB for the 2nd year of the project.

- 20. School Zone Flashing Beacons, PW2107; DPW has the material to install the school zone flashing beacons for Cypress Trails Elementary and will schedule the work. We issued a P.O. for the fifteen (15) flashing beacons for Crestwood Middle School & H.L. Johnson Elementary School. Additionally, we coordinated with our consultant for the design and permitting for flashing warning signs for school crossings on Crestwood Blvd. at the intersections of Sparrow Dr. & Park Road N and at H.L. Johnson Elementary School. DPW will bid/quote for the flashing warning signs this fiscal year, FY2022.
- 21. Sporting Center: Lighting Replacement (Main Floor); DPW is replacing the interior lighting on the 2nd Floor at the Sporting Center with LED using in-house labor. We have replaced 36 and have 17 left to replace. We will replace the remaining interior lights this fiscal year, FY2022.
- 22. Okeechobee Blvd. Main Entrance Sign Improvements; DPW is coordinating with our consultant for a conceptual drawing for the entry sign improvements.
- 23. Royal Pine Estates Entry Sign, PW2203; DPW staff are coordinating and developing a work plan for the improvements to the entry sign.
- 24. DPW is coordinating with GIS on the review of No Wake Zones in the Village.
- 25. La Mancha Underdrain, PW2204; The existing project is for material only with the intent of installing with in-house labor. We are developing 3rd party costs for the entire north extent of the La Mancha Subdivision and including this project in ARPA.
- 26. FOC Roof Replacement, PW2201; DPW executed a CSA for the design of the roof at the FOC. The roof will be replaced with a standing seam metal roof. The project includes painting the building with colors TBD. As soon as the plans are completed DPW will bid the project.
- 27. FOC Window Replacement, PW2206; DPW executed a CSA for the design of the window replacement at the FOC. The windows will be replaced with impact windows. As soon as the plans are completed DPW will quote the project. The roof replacement is part of the Village's roof replacement program.
- 28. Canal Bank Maintenance, PW2205; DPW coordinated with GIS to prepare exhibits for a bid package to provide canal bank maintenance. This project is a multi-year project. The first areas to be worked on will be the Camellia ditch and the canal that runs adjacent to Sparrow Dr. from the boat ramp to Royal Palm Beach Blvd.
- 29. DPW is currently preparing the NPDES annual report for submission to FDEP.
- 30. Bus Shelters, PW22BS; DPW issued P.O. for the replacement of a bus shelter that was destroyed in an accident.

- 31. Street Restriping, PW22SR; DPW is evaluating the striping needs and is quoting the pavement marking needs associated with the installation of the flashing beacons at the schools in the Village.
- 32. Bus Shelter Enhancement, PW2022; DPW is currently quoting alternate shelters for installation at stops with no shelter provided.
- 33. Royal Pine Estates Entry Sign, PW2207; DPW is quoting for a roadway bore to install a sleeve for the extension of irrigation to the sign landscape area.
- 34. Fountain Replacement, PW2208; DPW is evaluating fountain replacement needs for the current fiscal year. We will revise this CIP for FY2023 to make the project a multi-year project.
- 35 Bus Shelters: Update Report; DPW is currently evaluating alternatives for bus stops with limited ROW for installation of our standard bus shelter. When this effort is complete, we will update our report on bus stops and present to Council.

- 1. Coordinate with the Village Engineer and FDOT to turn the street lighting on SR80 & SR7 over to FPL. The discussion with FDOT will include the replacement of the decorative street lights on SR80. The SR80 lights have reached their useful life and need to be replaced.
- 2. ARPA Budget for Stormwater Projects; DPW is preparing budgets for stormwater projects to be included in ARPA funding. Many of the projects are multi-year that are currently budgeted in the CIP. During the budgeting for FY2023, DPW will complete evaluation of needs for each project and will estimate the budget needed to complete the improvements. The following is a list of projects that we will be evaluating for ARPA:
- 3. Bridge Slope Stabilization, PW1806, ARPA Fund (Currently funded as multi-year project in 302 Fund); DPW has completed 4 of the 16 bridges that are included in the project. The budget for the remaining 12 bridges would be approximately \$3,000,000.
- 4. Drainage System Improvements, PW1903, ARPA Fund (Currently funded project in 302 Fund); DPW has executed CSA for the design of the improvements on Heron Parkway. The scope of the project will need to be modified to include the improvements identified in the last Stormwater Master Plan Update: Increase size of two (2) 18" pipes on Park Road N; Increase the size of two (2) 24" and one (1) 15" pipe in Cypress Head subdivision; and, increase the size of five (5) 18" & one (1) 15" pipes in the Willows subdivision. An estimated budget has not been prepared. The budget would be \$500,000-\$750,000.
- 5. Canal System Dredging, SW1901, ARPA Fund (Currently funded project in 302 Fund); The Engineering Dept. is managing this project. The proposed budget for dredging the entire Village canal system would be in the range of \$5,000,000 to \$10,000,000.
- 6. Storm Drain Outfalls, PW22SD, ARPA Fund (Currently funded as multi-year project in 302 Fund); DPW is currently evaluating all of the outfalls in the Village's canal system. We estimate that there 25 outfalls that need to repaired or replaced. The proposed budget for the R&R of storm drains would be in the range of \$300,000 to \$400,000.

- 7. La Mancha Subdivision Underdrain, PW2205, ARPA Fund (Currently funded as multi-year project in 303 Fund); DPW budgeted this project as a material only with the installation to be completed with in-house labor. The proposed budget for the installation of the underdrain would be in the range of \$1,000,000 to 2,000,000.
- 8. Canal Bank Maintenance, PW2205, ARPA Fund (Currently funded as multi-year project in 303 Fund); The proposed budget for completing the canal bank maintenance for the complete Village canal system would be in the range of \$250,000 to \$500,000.
- 9. Camellia Park Drainage Improvements, PR1822, ARPA Fund (Currently funded project in 408 Fund); The Engineering Dept. is managing this project. The proposed budget for the drainage improvements would be in the range of \$150,000 to \$250,000.
- 10. Covid-19; The Village After-Action Report/Improvement Plan (AAR/IP) identified the need to have adequate stock of personal protective equipment (PPE). DPW is evaluating the current stock of PPE and will re-stock, as needed.
- 11. Okeechobee Entry Sign Landscape, PW2402; DPW is currently working with our landscape architect to prepare a conceptual plan for the proposed landscape improvements. We propose to move this project into the FY2023 CIP. The future project is currently funded in 303 Fund but could be moved to the 102 Beautification Fund.

- As the Village's population continues to grow due to new residential developments, business complexes and assisted living facilities, so does the dynamics and challenges of preventing crime in the Village. Preventing Violent Crimes while maintaining the high level of service the residents of Royal Palm are accustomed to continues to be more challenging for law enforcement.
- Although decreased through intense residential road patrol presence, residential burglaries continue to be addressed through Directed Patrols and the utilization of undercover surveillance equipment and vehicles.
- Increased Financial and Internet Crimes are becoming one of the biggest challenges that law enforcement has to face both locally and nationally.
- Surveillance & technology equipment updates are needed in order to stay one step ahead of criminals.
- Non-compliance to education given on safe guarding against criminals (i.e. unlocked vehicle doors and personal belongings being left in vehicles.).
- Extensive investigations and hours of man power are still being expended on vehicle thefts, vehicle burglaries, and other property crime.


- 1. The Case Management System continues to assist in case prioritization and management. This allows a more efficient and effective way to track progress and case load for the three Detectives assigned to District 9.
- 2. The growth in the Village of Royal Palm Beach continues. In the last few years, the Village has increased its population by thousands and with the pending new developments and businesses that number is expected to rise by an additional thousand or two. The challenge will be to keep up with the type of enforcement that the Village has become accustom to with the current level of law enforcement deputies.
- 3. Re-opening and recruitment for participants in the District 9 PAL Program. A civilian part-time employee is assigned to the program and continuous outreach is underway to increase the number of participants to the free, afterschool program.

- 6. Continue to find ways to partner with Village for betterment of the community.

- 8. Continued access and processing of Fingerprinting services at the District 9 Substation.
- 9. Continued success of the ARU Specialist as the first-contact at the District 9 Lobby.
- 10. Continue educational and technical training for staff by utilizing Village's training fund.

- 11. Continued analysis of Sector patrol boundaries to ensure they are equally distributed for calls for service.
- 12. Evaluating the business and residential growth in and around the Village of Royal Palm Beach including new construction projects.
- 13. Continued participation in the Technical Staff Review (TSR) process incorporating CPTED principals.
- 14. Maintaining the exemplary level of law enforcement services in and around the Village of Royal Palm Beach as it continues to grow in size and population through new businesses, homes and charter schools.

CRISIS – Real Definition

- 1. Time of instability uncertain and unpredictable events and consequences
- 2. Time of danger personal threats to life and daily living
- 3. Time of emotionally significant events emotional upheaval or radical change in our personal, family and community professional manner lives
- 4. Time of a turning point sequence of events which will impact all future events
- 5. Time of confusion -lack of clarity or certainty and sense of bewilderment
- 6. Time of hostility -hostile elements tensely opposing each other in a story or drama
- 7. Time of suffering personal hardships for families and individuals
- 8. Time of sacrifice giving up something of value and taking personal responsibility for community benefits
- 9. Time of fear personal anxiety and dreaded feeling of impending doom, danger or personal threat
- 10. Time of decisive moment issues arise on an hourly basis, needing immediate decisions, many of these decisions lead to significant changes; every decision is watched and "second guessed"

LEADERSHIP – Time for leaders to step up and to:

- 1. Reinforce your and your organization's core values let them guide your decisions and actions
- 2. Use the strategic plan and process rather than abandon the plan and process avoid actions based upon the moment
- 3. Focus and adjust priorities and resources, use the strategic plan and process to re-calibrate services and redirect priorities when necessary
- 4. Develop tactical plans guided by vision and outcomes and have flexibility with contingency options adjusting routinely [Note: there will likely be surprises and the unexpected; and no miracle "cure"]

- 10. Look for new methods and processes for connecting with the community especially using technology; you have the community's attention it may be easier to connect with the community now
- 11. Reach out to and expand community partners working together to address the crisis
- 12. Keep other community leaders informed and asking for help in communicating with all segments of the community
- 13. Evaluate and refine organizational services, processes and service delivery improvements that may endure in the future
- 14. Look at every moment as a learning and personal development opportunity

- 15. Instill a sense of reality, a sense of calm and a sense of hope/optimism for the future



Definitions of Terms

POLICY -

is an issue that needs direction or a policy decision by the Council; or needs a major funding decision by the Council; or an issue that needs Council leadership by the governing body in the community; or with other governmental bodies (Village government, other Village governments, state government, federal government) – questions of "WHAT: IS THE DIRECTION; IS THE GOAL; IS THE BUDGET OR RESOURCES; IS THE VILLAGE'S POLICY OF REGULATION?"

MANAGEMENT -

a management action which the Council has set the overall direction and provided initial funding (e.g., phased project), may require further Council action on funding; or a major management project particularly multiple years (e.g., upgrade to the information system) – questions of "HOW: DO WE ADDRESS THE ISSUE, MANAGE THE VILLAGE; IMPLEMENT A DECISION OR PROGRAM; CAN WE IMPROVE THE MANAGEMENT OR ORGANIZATIONAL PROCESS?"

MANAGEMENT IN PROGRESS -

a management or organization action which Council has set the direction, needs staff work before going to Council for direction next year or beyond, no choice mandated by an outside governmental agency or institution, management process improvement budgeted or funded by the Council.

MAJOR PROJECT -

a capital project funded in the CIP or by Council action which needs design or to be constructed (e.g., Road project, Village facility project, park project, etc.).

ON THE HORIZON –

an issue or project that will not be addressed during the year by management or the Council but should be addressed in the next five years; it could become an action item for this year if another party moves the issue or project forward – it depends on them.




